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Background to the rffada

Elizabeth [Anne] Russell, the founder of the rffada, is the birth mother of two children with Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder; her youngest son has full FAS. She has lobbied extensively on both a state and national level to raise awareness about FASD issues since 2000. In addition to the key activities undertaken by volunteers of the rffada, Anne has also written three books on this condition and her family's journey, the first books on FASD in Australia. She has also delivered training and development workshops to parents, carers, drug and alcohol workers, disability workers, mental health workers, medical practitioners, midwives and other various community organisations throughout Australia.

In the financial year 2014-2015, the rffada delivered 41 education and training workshops to 394 participants in remote Indigenous and mainstream communities across Australia. We prepared 7 submissions and facilitated 5 face to face support groups since they commenced five months ago. We have over 500 individuals and organisations in our main FaceBook group and almost 200 parents supported in our 'secret' parents and carers FaceBook group. Our FaceBook page for people with FASD where they are able to speak to each other, learn from each other, and support each other has been utilised by a great many more people than expected.

The flow on effect from the delivery of our presentations, the support of our parents and carers and the dissemination of information through our Facebook groups is estimated to have helped a great many more people.

We have distributed 10,000 brochures. We had printed 5,000 mainstream brochures and 5,000 brochures specifically for Indigenous people. rffada Fact Sheets have been printed and distributed to participants at each of the education or training sessions that has been delivered.

This year the rffada has travelled to many different locations to deliver training: Doomadgee, Mornington Island, Cairns, Brisbane, Karratha, Townsville, Thursday Island, Bamaga, Seisia, New Mapoon, Napranum, Nanum, Mapoon, Lockhart, Cooktown, Hopevale, Wujal, Beswick, Katherine and Alice Springs.

The rffada has been featured in several publications. The NOFAS Circle of Hope Newsletter, Iceberg, the Cairns Post and has been on the radio and television.
