Mum at 25 years old - bills mounting, difficulty coping, strain on relationship, time can only go to child, friends help, joy of being a parent is crushed with demands and frustrations, professional disregard of plight, unable to return to work doctors misdiagnose and |or ignorant of FASD, they just don't get it

Child at 2-3 years - child demanding, a loner, temper tantrums, developmentally delayed and demanding, cute, mischievous, runs away, hyperactive, looks for excitement, needs 24|7 supervision, difficult to find solutions despite increasing financial burden - home life impacted, increasing parental fatigue and discord as parents blame each other, grandparents can't cope, extended family unsupportive and |or stressed, friends refuse to assist

Mum at 30 years - dismay and confusion – why me? Loves her child but feels guilty about not loving enough - is it something to do with her enjoyment of an occasional drink when pregnant? Child at 10 years - in year 4 but developmentally much younger, inappropriate sexual behaviour, slow in literacy, maths and language skills, refuses to do homework, always unwell, just got glasses and had grommet operation

Mum at 40 years – tired, anxiety disorder, clinical depression, ongoing tension, parents have been constantly in touch with school, now child has been expelled, arguing and blaming each other, extended family refuse to help, mother has to stop work to stay with teenager as he must be supervised

Child at 15 years of age – stealing, increasing financial burden, drinking, fighting, using drugs, mixing and being manipulated by gangs, stealing cars, fighting, known to police and juvenile courts, rejects counselling, sexually active,

quarrelsome at home, demands money and refuses to leave - extended family and neighbours complaining, increasingly aggressive and volatile, unpredictable violence, police involvement

Mum at 50 years – exhausted and resigned to rearing grandchildren, meeting brick walls, constant cries for help ignored, superannuation and economic independence impacted, struggling to cope with financial burden, emotional disempowerment – ex-husband doesn't cope with children or grandchildren, living separately, victims of elder abuse, active in FASD advocacy, political and medical blockades protecting alcohol industry, unable to retire but must stop work to raise grandchildren

Child at 25 years - Has been incarcerated for assault including sexual assault, break and enter, car and other theft, drug peddling and use, mental health problems and suicide attempts, unemployment – in fact never been employed, has been injured in car accident
